If there was a support group for pastors, it could be "H.S.A." – Holiday Sermons Anonymous. All pastors struggle with holiday messages. If they say they don't, they've not been pastoring long enough or hop to a new church every three years. The longer you preach and, especially, the longer you stay at one church, the harder it gets. The questions begin as early as the summer:

- How am I going to tell the same story in a fresh way?
- Could I shake it up with pyrotechnics or laser lights? The youth would like that; the senior adults . . . not so much.
- What scripture texts should I use? I've already preached Luke and Matthew a couple of times each. I know most everyone has forgotten what I said, but some lady has written in her Bible margin, "Dr. Stewart Holloway, 12/12/10," and a few have detailed notes in their journals.
- Should I do a monologue like I did back in 2008 and 2009? Maybe I should reprise Joseph from 2008 or the King from 2009? (I do need to do that sometime, but baby Zach was the real draw in 2008!).

This year, the idea for the Christmas sermon series didn't come until early November! I was STRESSING! But it was worth the wait. I've enjoyed preparing the *Humble or Humbug* Christmas series more than any series I've preached in my fifteen years of preaching Christmas sermons as a pastor. It's brought me to new ideas, helped me learn new legends behind traditions, and even caused me to discover new traditions (like spider ornaments – I still don't get why anyone would want that!). Most of all, it has done exactly what a Christmas series should do – help us look at Christmas in a fresh way.



As you enjoy the celebrations over the last few weeks of this year, remember to stay humble and don't be a humbug. Be a genuine follower of Jesus Christ. It's not Merry MEmas, it's Merry CHRISTmas! AND – Jesus doesn't need any tinsel.

I hope you have a blessed Christmas. As always, "It's a great time to Be F.I.R.S.T.!"

F.I.R.S.T. Kid's Corner

As we wrap up 2018 and look forward to 2019, this quote by Benjamin Franklin came to my mind, "If you fail to plan, you are planning to fail!"
